Equine Canada Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the National Equestrian Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of all horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives ;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competitions procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

SILVER & BRONZE GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. The Glanbrook Cadora Bronze & Silver Competitions are sanctioned competitions of Equestrian Canada (EC), 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and are governed by the [Rules of EC](#). (A602.1) and (A602.2) Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. **Competitors are responsible for knowledge of the rules.**

2. As per Article A801 of the EC Rule Book, “every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition.” It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. **Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.”**

3. Competitions at the Ancaster location will operate 2 rings. Both rings will begin at approximately 8:30 a.m.

- The competitions at Trinity Trotters operate with one ring. The Bronze show will begin at approximately 8:30 a.m. and the Silver show will begin at approximately 1: 30 p.m. For both Bronze and Silver competitions at this location, the number of entries accepted will be limited to the time available.

- For events at all locations, show grounds will be open approximately one hour before the start of the competition.

- Stabling will be available at the Ancaster Fairground shows. Stabling at private facilities is not generally available but if it is, it must be arranged directly with the venue and fees paid to the venue.

- All entries must be entirely complete to be considered (all fees, all photocopies, all information submitted).

4. Tests - The (New) Introductory Tests are USEF “A” - C” 2019. Note that Introductory C has a Canter requirement. The Training Level through Fourth Level Tests used in Glanbrook Cadora Bronze and Silver shows are the **USEF 2019** tests available on the [Dressage Canada website](#). The Training Level through Fourth Level Freestyle Tests are also **USEF 2019** tests. FEI Prix St. George, Intermediate 1 are offered in the Silver classes.

5. Thoroughbred Incentive Program -T.I.P. Glanbrook CADORA will be participating in the Jockey Club T.I.P. for the 2019 show season. Only Thoroughbreds that have been registered with

The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club are eligible to participate in the T.I.P. program for awards.

To participate in this awards program, riders/owners should obtain a T.I.P. number for all Thoroughbred horse/rider combinations. That is, if two riders show the same horse, then both riders need their own T.I.P. number for the horse/rider combination. T.I.P. number applications are done online at www.tjctip.com. TIP numbers must be placed onto the Glanbrook show entry form and photocopies of the T.I.P. cards provided to Glanbrook to be kept on record. Originals must be present on show day if asked. A minimum of three (3) shows are needed to participate in year-end awards. The highest percentage score obtained at each show qualify. The three highest scores are tallied together to give the year-end high score. **Note: For 2019 Glanbrook will offer T.I.P. placing only for the first 3 shows.** The last show of the season (our 4th) is the Cadora Silver Championship which does not offer T.I.P.

6. Protective Headgear: All athletes, regardless of age or level of competition, must wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear at all times when mounted at any EC-sanctioned Dressage competition at the event location. (see E 4.0 Safety Headgear). Note: At the tack check that follows the test, the steward may ask the athlete to dismount so that the helmet can be inspected for safety standard labeling.

7. Safety Vests: Any athlete competing in an EC-sanctioned dressage competition is permitted to wear a safety vest. The vest must conform to the rules governing jacket colours (see E4.0.1 Safety Vests).

8. Return to Play Rule: Equestrian Canada has implemented a concussion-related policy, Article A101 Accidents & Return To Play. Glanbrook shows will follow all provisions of this policy. Please review on page 1 of the [Equestrian Canada Rulebook](#).

9. Medication control testing fees: Any horse entered in any class at a competition (Bronze and Silver) may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (See (A602.5) An EC-specified drug testing fee is assessed on each entry (Bronze - \$3.50 and Silver - \$7.00).

10. Other Fees: A \$10.00 **Administration Fee** is levied on each entry and a **Dressage Canada Levy of \$10.00** will be added to each entry to support DC programs. These fees will be forwarded to the appropriate organization.

11. Any person issuing an **NSF cheque(s)** to Glanbrook Cadora will be required to pay the amount of the cheque plus bank service charges plus \$10.00 to remain "in good standing". Failure to pay the amount owing will result in the person being reported to EC for non-payment and may be listed as "Not in Good Standing".

12. Persons Responsible: The entry form **must** be signed by the **Person Responsible (PR)**, who must be an EC Sport License holder. In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry forms without holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. (See A801.6, A213.2).

13. Cancellations/Refunds: Cancellations may be made up until the closing date of the competition with no penalty. After the closing date, a veterinary or medical certificate (on official letterhead) is required and entry fees will be refunded (**upon notification by 6:00 PM on the Friday preceding the competition date**). Presentation of a veterinary or medical certificate, on official letterhead, for illness or injury must be made **within 15 days** after the competition in order to receive a refund. N1S 4Z9 Cancellations made the day of the competition will forfeit the entries (please notify the secretary's desk if you are cancelling). Glanbrook Cadora regrets that refunds cannot be issued for classes cancelled due to inclement weather conditions. If you are unable to compete for other reasons, entry fees cannot be refunded. To help us to run our competitions effectively, please be courteous and notify the competition if you must cancel.

14. Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place in all classes. Junior divisions will be held in Walk/Trot, Training and First Levels of Bronze shows if there are **at least two** junior entries and in all classes and levels of Silver shows if there are **at least two** junior entries. A High Point ribbon will be awarded at each show. Riders in classes Training Level 1 and higher are eligible.

15. More than one rider may ride the same horse/pony at a competition providing that the horse/pony is not entered by two riders in the same class. No horse/pony may be ridden in more than four tests (including the freestyle) in one day. Competitors may show in no more than two consecutive levels or four classes/day.

16. With permission of the show manager, horses may be entered hors concours (non-competitive). **Hors concours entries** are not eligible for prizes, placings or awards. Such entries must pay the full entry fee and are subject to all EC rules, including having EC horse identification where required. (See Article E.7.11.11 for further information).

17. To be eligible for any **Glanbrook awards**, membership in Cadora Inc., Cadora-Ontario and Glanbrook Cadora must be obtained for **both rider and owner** of the horse by the end of the first competition of the current season and the horse/rider combination must show in a minimum of two Glanbrook Cadora Silver and/or Bronze competitions in 2019.

18. A \$10 late fee will be applied to any entries received after the **closing date** for the show assuming that there is room for them in the show. Limited post-entries, either after the closing date for entries or on the day of the show may be available (late fees will apply).

19. Entries will be accepted on a "first come, first served" basis and may be limited due to volume. **Entries must be complete.** Incomplete entries (e.g. lack of copy of OE card/License card/page missing/ horse licence sticker) may result in non-acceptance. Entries from members "Not in Good Standing" must/will be refused. Closing dates for each show are indicated on the respective entry form, and closing dates may be subject to moving earlier due to an abundance

of entries. Please refer to our website for any changes. Entry fees **MUST** accompany the entries or they **will** be refused. **Substitution** of horse or rider requests received after the show closing date will be at the discretion of the show manager.

20. Neither Glanbrook Cadora, the show management and volunteers, show officials, property owners nor their employees will be in any way responsible for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors or spectators.

21. Competition numbers must be worn at all times by the horse or handler, for identification by the steward, while on the show grounds or risk elimination from the show

22. No lunging is permitted in the warm-up area(s).

23. On competition day, there will be no hand-walking or use of the competition ring area or inside the fenced area surrounding it, other than during the performance.

24. Someone certified in **First Aid** will be available on-site. A veterinarian and farrier will be on-call for equine emergencies.

25. Freestyles: All tapes/CDs should be handed to the show secretary at least one hour before the start of the Freestyle class. The CD or tape must be labeled with the horse's and rider's name and include instructions of how and when the music is to be started (e.g. rider will wave hand at K). Electronic forms of music (e.g. iPod) will not be available.

26. Caller's dress code: Smart casual. Jeans, slacks, and mid length shorts are permitted. Tank tops are not allowed. Inappropriately dressed callers may not be allowed to call a test (See E9.1)

27. Alternative and/or additional information on any competition will be included in the Glanbrook Cadora newsletter and posted on the Glanbrook Cadora website (www.glanbrookcadora.ca)

28. Dogs are best left at home, if brought to the show site they must be leashed at all times.

29. PARKING –Follow parking instructions to be provided by attendants and signage as you enter the competition site.

BRONZE GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1.** For Bronze Competitions, **entry fees** for Glanbrook Cadora members will be \$30.00/class and \$35.00/class for non-members. There will be a \$2.00 number deposit which will be refunded if the number is returned in good condition by the end of the show. Fees may be submitted by e-transfer to glanbrookcadora@gmail.com Entry forms and membership proofs must accompany the transfer.
- 2.** In compliance with OE/EC rules, **all riders and owners** of horses competing in Bronze Competitions **MUST** be members of the OE and hold an EC Bronze License (minimum) **and** are required to send a photocopy of their current membership cards with their entries.
- 3.** The **Training Level Freestyle Test and Prix Caprilli Test** (dressage test over fences) are Cadora Inc. tests and are available on the [CADORA website](#). All other tests, both FEI and National are available on the [Dressage Canada](#) website. These tests will be ridden in the 20x60 m arena.
- 4.** All **Introductory and Training Level tests**, with the exception of Western Tests, at Glanbrook Cadora BRONZE Competitions will be ridden in the **20 X 40m** arena. All Western, First Level Tests and above will be ridden in the **20 X 60m** arena.
- 5.** **Western Style Dressage Classes** will be offered as EC Miscellaneous classes at Bronze Glanbrook shows on June 2, July 28 and August 25. The classes will follow the rules of WSDAC (Western Style Dressage Association of Canada). Tests are available on the [Western Style Dressage Assoc. of Canada](#) website. Ribbons are offered to 6th place. Add the WSDAC member number on the entry form to ensure reporting of scores to the Association for their awards program. These classes are not rated for EC Awards. All other EC rules such as those pertaining to membership, equine medications control and entry status apply to all local and miscellaneous classes held at a sanctioned competition. Western classes are ridden in the 20x60 arena.
- 6.** It is now mandatory that all Bronze riders must present themselves to the steward for a **tack check** after completing each test. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Canadian horses competing in Silver Competitions are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete or if owned by a temporary sport license holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. The Horse Recording must be handed in to the Competition Secretary before a horse will be allowed to compete. ANNUAL AWARDS

RIDER/HORSE OF THE YEAR AWARDS

Gold, silver and bronze medallions will be awarded (based on points accumulated throughout the season) in each of Walk/Trot, Training Level Test 1, Training, First, Second, Third, Fourth Levels and Freestyle classes. To qualify, it is necessary for **both the rider and owner** of the horse, to be a Cadora Inc., Cadora-Ontario, and Glanbrook Cadora member, and the rider must compete in (for 2019 only) a minimum of two Glanbrook Cadora (Bronze and/or Silver) dressage shows.

Points for placings will be awarded in the following manner:

1st - 6 points	4th - 3 point
2nd - 5 points	5th - 2 points
3rd - 4 points	6th - 1 point

These awards are for **horse/rider** combinations.

MIKE VAN DYK MEMORIAL TROPHY

Note: This Trophy will not be awarded in 2019 due to the 4th Glanbrook show being replaced by the Silver Championships.

VOLUNTEER AWARDS AND INCENTIVES

An engraved plaque is awarded to a volunteer who provides extraordinary service to Glanbrook shows and events through assistance with particular projects such as finding sponsorships or by hours of support given to support the club. This individual is identified by the Glanbrook executive members.

Monetary incentive awards in the form of gift cards are presented to volunteers based on the number of hours given to Glanbrook shows and events.

Volunteer awards are presented at the Annual General Meeting in the fall.

WHAT MEMBERSHIPS DO I NEED FOR 2019?

For the **Silver** level at the Glanbrook Cadora Dressage Shows in 2019, you will need an EC Silver Membership, A Dressage Canada Affiliate membership, and your OE membership. If you are an amateur, you **must** have the Amateur Status box marked on your EC card. Your horse must have a [2019 Horse Recording](#) (this replaces the printed Horse Passport & annual sticker). If you do not own the horse, the owner must have the appropriate license and be an OE and EC member. All of the above membership forms can be found on the OE or EC websites.

If you show at the **Bronze** level at the Glanbrook Cadora Dressage Shows in 2019, you will need an EC Bronze Membership and your OE membership. If you do not own the horse, the owner must have the appropriate license and be an OE and EC member. All of the above membership forms can be found on the OE or EC websites.

Optional Memberships

Glanbrook Cadora: To be eligible for Glanbrook Cadora year end awards and a savings on your entries, you must join the group by the end of the first show of 2019. Please go to the membership tab on this website. If you do not own the horse, the **owner** must be an EC and OE member.

Cadora: To be eligible for Cadora and Cadora-Ontario awards, you need to join Cadora by July 1st of the current year. Membership includes Provincial and National Cadora membership. Members receive an Omnibus Test Booklet, membership card, Cadora Ink and Cadora-Ontario newsletters and the ability to participate in Cadora and Cadora-Ontario awards and educational programs.

Dressage Canada: Full members receive newsletters and the “Competition” booklet. Scores from Silver dressage competitions will be eligible for DC Achievement Awards. Please see the [Dressage Canada website](#) for more information. **DC Affiliate membership is required to show at the Silver level.**
